I am very excited and eager to welcome everyone back for another exciting year at HBHS. It has been a wonderful summer and I hope you all had a chance to enjoy the beautiful weather and some family time to relax and rejuvenate. It is hard to believe that as I sit and write this we are contemplating Hurricane Irene and the possibility of having to cancel the first work day back for staff! Only in New England – but we would not have it any other way! Bob Ouellette, Rick Barnes and I have spent the summer working to ensure that we hire the best of the best for new staff and are very excited to welcome 12 new staff members to the school. All have much to offer and bring a wide range of experience and skills. Our teachers are exemplars of their profession and they are committed to meeting each student where they are as they move them along the continuum of their high school career in order to prepare them for the challenges of adulthood and the 21st century.

On that same note, I am continually amazed at just how hard each of our students strives to be their best and meet the challenges and expectations set by their teachers. We have great kids who come from supportive and caring families. Together we usher these delightful young people through their high school years and ensure that they are prepared to meet the adventure that awaits them as they journey off into the world! What a wonderful task we share.

The school is already beginning to hustle and bustle with the fall athletic programs beginning. In a few short days we will be welcoming all our incoming freshmen, transfer students, and returning students. Wednesday, August 31st will be our annual orientation for freshmen and new students. Students will be greeted by staff and volunteers from upper classes. This will be an early release day with students being dismissed at 12:04. Thursday we will see the return of all students for the first full day of the year. On Thursday we will run a Monday 7-period day and Friday we will run a regular Friday schedule, again, with all 7 periods.

As we did last year, we are very pleased to be able to run our PLC Friday's with classes beginning at 8:05. The PLC Friday schedule will begin on Friday, September 9th. Students will be able to participate in group meetings, study time, intramural activities in the gym, and will have access to computer labs and the Media Center from 7:15 until 8:00. Students who wish may arrive at 8:00 in time for classes that will begin promptly at 8:05.

Every staff member at HBHS continually emphasizes the key to a successful educational experience is building positive relationships and providing all students with a rigorous and relevant education. Our excellent teaching staff continually sets the bar at a high, yet attainable, level for students. We continue to work compassionately with all students to support them as they strive to reach their goals.

Our dedicated and hardworking custodial crew, led by Mr. John Gray, has worked long and hard over the summer and the school looks fabulous! They have cleaned the school from top to bottom - painting, scrubbing, repairing, replacing, and polishing until every nook and cranny sparkles! A big thank you goes out to all of them.

There are some important dates to get on your calendar. Our Open House will be on September 14th at 6:30 p.m. This is a great opportunity to meet your child's teacher and learn about the course and teacher expectations. At that time you will be able to sign up for individual teacher conferences which will take place on Thursday, November 17 and Monday, November 21 beginning at 3:00 pm. School pictures will be taken on Thursday, September 15th. All students will be issued a student ID and will be expected to carry it each day at school.

We are putting the finishing touches on our student handbook. There some adjustments we have made to it so please review the handbook with your child. At the beginning of the school year, teachers will review the changes with all students. You can access the student handbook online from the HBHS Homepage - Student Information - Student Handbook. We will email a copy of the handbook home at the beginning of the school year.

A new initiative this year is to provide wireless internet access to students via VLAN. Students will be able to bring their own laptops, ipads, etc., to school and access the internet. VLAN is currently up and running for staff. **We will begin allowing internet access to students with the seniors first**, offering them a week to try this out. If all access points work well, we will expand the access one class at a time (juniors, then sophomores, then freshmen) until all students are able to access the internet. We will keep everyone informed of the timeline as we move forward. While accessing the wireless internet, students must comply with the Acceptable Use Policy they signed, and access is limited in the same manner as school computers.

In reviewing our mission statement, it is clear that we value and nurture the holistic development of each student. While academic rigor is at the core of our educational system, our goal is to educate students who will become responsible and productive members of society, and that requires more than academics. We value so much more than just the grades on a report card. We value each individual as a whole person, and that is the fundamental reason HBHS is such a special and successful place to be. I assure you, your student could not be in a better school for their high school career.

In closing, together we will provide a supportive educational environment where all students have the opportunity to be successful. We will live up to the expectations of our mission statement and provide each student with the education, skills, and self-confidence needed to be successful in whatever they choose to do when they graduate from Hollis Brookline High School. Opening of School

School will be opening on Wednesday, August 31st with our Orientation Day for freshmen, transfer students, and foreign exchange students. This will be an Early Release day. (Students will be dismissed at 12:04pm.) New students, along with many upperclassmen, will be attending a half day of school with the goal being a smooth transition and adjustment to their high school experience. Students will be engaging in a variety of experiences that will ultimately lead to their success and confidence within our school community. **ALL STUDENTS WILL ATTEND SCHOOL ON THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 1st.**

Physical Exam Requirements

All incoming freshmen are required to have a physical exam in order to enter Hollis Brookline High School. All juniors participating in athletics are required to have a physical exam prior to the start of their season. Open House

Parents are cordially invited to attend our annual Open House on Wednesday, September 14th at 6:30 PM. There will be a brief presentation by the Hollis Brookline High School Administration, followed by an abbreviated schedule of a regular school day. There will be seven 12-minute periods to allow parents to follow their child's schedule. Open House gives parents the opportunity to meet the teachers and for teachers to briefly discuss their courses. (Please see the form at page 6 in this newsletter.)

Locker Assignments

All students will have a locker. Returning students will retain the same locker they had last year. If you have any difficulties with combinations, please report them to the main office. Locker assignments will be given out on the first day of school. As we are growing in numbers, some freshmen may be assigned a half locker. Please remember that the lockers are provided with locks for the protection of school materials and student's private property. **Please note that valuables and cash should never be left in a locker.** You are responsible for the materials that are assigned to you for the year. All school materials must be returned by the last day of school. Lockers are cleaned out at the close of each school year.

Dismissals

While we understand that on occasion emergencies arise which require your student to be dismissed early, we ask that whenever possible you schedule your student's appointments at times which do not conflict with school hours. Students should never be dismissed because of a study hall that falls at the end of the day. When your student must be dismissed early, we ask that you please send a written note prior to the dismissal. **All notes should be submitted to the attendance secretary first thing in the morning.**

School Pictures and Yearbook

Underclassmen photographs will be taken on Thursday, September 15th. Order forms will be available at the beginning of the school year and should be returned on picture day. Picture retake day will be announced at a later date. Reminder to seniors: Senior photographs are due no later than October 1st. They must be in .jpeg format and submitted by email or by CD only. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Lin Illingworth at 465-2269. See the Daily Notices for more information. **All yearbooks must be pre-ordered.**

Parking Permits

Parking permits will be required for all students parking in the student parking lot in the back of the building. Last year's permit will NOT be honored and all students must apply for the new parking permit at a cost of \$40.00 for the year. Parking Permits are limited and are available on our website under "Student Information". A copy of your driver's license is required with your application. This year, students will be assigned a numbered parking spot, which will coincide with your permit. Permits will be granted on a first come, first served basis to seniors from Sept. 1st through Sept. 7th in the Main Office. Applications for juniors will be accepted from Sept. 8th through Sept. 14th in the Main Office and will be placed in a lottery. Names for juniors will be drawn for the remaining parking spots on Sept. 15th. **No students will be permitted to park in front of the school except at the lower ballfields.** All cars parked in the back parking lot after Sept. 16 must have a parking permit. Applications are available in the Main Office and on the HBHS website.

School Supplies

As a general rule, it is best to wait until school opens to purchase supplies. Teachers have individual requirements for their classes and will announce their requirements during the opening days of class. Pens, pencils and paper are appropriate for all classes.

POLICY CHANGE EFFECTIVE FOR 2011/2012 SCHOOL YEAR: Physical Exam requirements. All students entering HBHS will have a complete physical exam every two years, normally in grades 9 and 11. Documentation from the medical provider will be kept in the student's health record. Anyone participating in athletics is required to have proof of physical prior to tryouts.

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BOOSTER CLUB NEWS

The HBHS Athletic Booster Club will have a pre-school year meeting Monday 29th @ 7pm in the HBHS conference room. Our regular meetings during the school year are the 2nd Wednesday of each month at 7pm.

As a quick review for those who may be NEW to the HBHS athletics or unaware of how they support the athletic teams:

There are 3 different Booster Clubs at Hollis-Brookline H.S. The Football and Hockey programs are funded by their own Booster Clubs. The school does not pay for transportation, officials, equipment and other expenses for these teams. The pay-to-play fee and out-of-pocket expenses for these players/parents is much higher per player than those sports funded by the school AD budget. These teams do separate fundraising as a result of the lack of support from the AD budget that is provided within the school budget. Please support their efforts — it is ALL for the kids.

The Athletic Department Booster Club provides support to all sports throughout the school year. The school AD budget/pay-to-play fees do not cover many expenses that each sport has over the season: officials, transportation, post-season play, etc. The ABC provides money for requests from coaches for uniforms, equipment, championship gifts/recognition, etc. The awards, slide show, manpower for each end-of-season Awards night is fully funded by the ABC. Here is a condensed list of how we have supported teams over the last several years:

- Scholarships for Leadership, Outstanding Effort, and Sportsmanship to graduating seniors

Selective Service Registration.

The Selective Service System is an independent agency within the Executive Branch of the Federal Government. The mission of the Selective Service System is to provide the number of men needed by the Armed Forces, within the time required, should Congress and the President decide to return to a draft, in the event of a national emergency. Registration is the process of providing the Selective Service with name, address, phone number, and other related information about one's self. It is a civic and legal responsibility for every young man to register with the Selective Service within the time period starting 30 days before, and ending 30 days after, their 18th birthday. Register online at www.sss.gov or pick up a registration card at any post office.



Parent Education Series

This year we will be focusing on the emotional development of our teens, and the first program in our Parent Education Series, ***The Art of Encouragement***, will be presented by renowned speaker, Jack Agati, on **Tuesday, October 4th** at the high school. The program will begin at **7pm**.

Jack is a dynamic and informative presenter who will address the following: ***How do we encourage a discouraged child?***

This often-asked question must be answered if we hope to bring about long-term changes in another's way of behaving. We need to look upon encouragement as a skill, an art that needs to be understood and practiced to be successful. At the end of this session, the participants will be able to distinguish between praise and encouragement as motivational tools, identify the three (3) techniques that others will use to discourage us from encouraging them, and explore ways to avoid becoming discouraged in our efforts to encourage others.

From Your Guidance Department

The Guidance Department extends a **warm welcome** to all of our returning students and to all our incoming 9th graders, transfer students and their families. We look forward to working with you throughout the 2011-12 academic year.

Summer Work — The Guidance Department offers a comprehensive curriculum including career, social/emotional and career services. This summer counselors worked on transcripts, college admissions, schedules, and the Guidance curriculum.

However, a priority this summer was to review our safety protocols at HBHS. In collaboration with the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) NH through its **Connect Suicide Prevention Project**, Hollis Brookline High School participated in a three-hour suicide prevention training session geared for high school counselors, social workers, psychologists, administrators and educators.

Statistics report that over 34,000 people die by suicide every year in the U.S. In many cases, these deaths can be prevented when loved ones recognize when a person is at risk and how to get them help. The Connect Suicide Prevention Program is a national Best Practice program developed by NAMI NH.

This was the first of an initiative provided to best prepare our staff to meet the needs of all students and recognize the signs of depression and students at risk. Hollis Brookline High School will continue to educate all members of the high school and interested community members so that we have a safety net in place to protect our students.

(If you or someone you know is at risk of suicide, contact your community mental health emergency services or 1-800-273-TALK (8255). Both of these resources are available 24/7.

Transfer Students — We have registered over 20 transfer students arriving to HBHS from all over the state, country, and world. Cathy Cray, SAP Counselor, arranged a wonderful luncheon for our transfer students to give them an opportunity to meet with each other and HBHS volunteer students to orient our new students and help them feel comfortable prior to the first day of school. We can't emphasize enough how important it is to get involved in some activity, a club or a sport at the high school. It is a great way to be a part of the school community, make friends with similar interests, and have fun. In addition, most colleges ask for club, activities, and extracurricular involvements while in high school, so you get a head start on the college process as well.

Counselor Appointments — Please know that we love meeting with our students. Every year, our one regret is that we did not spend more time with the students! Please help us by encouraging students to schedule appointments with their guidance counselor, as we will be discouraging students from just dropping in. We, too, must assist in honoring their academic instructional time, and more importantly it allows us to give the student who has patiently scheduled an appointment to encounter no interruptions. If a student has an emergency, please let Mrs. Noel know or check off on the slip that you need to see someone right away.

Parents wishing to make a Guidance appointment should email or call their son/daughter's guidance counselor with the request.

Drop/Add Procedures — Schedules will be distributed on the first day of school. During the initial course registration phase, students were asked to make their selections carefully, since staff is hired and resources are allocated based on these requests. Once the master schedule is developed, course changes are very limited. In the event that there needs to be a schedule adjustment, there is a drop/add period at the beginning of each semester to ensure students get the courses they need in a fair and equitable manner. Those who have an incomplete schedule or are in need of a graduation requirement are seen immediately. Drop/Add begins two days after the first full day of the fall semester and runs for an additional three days. Full-year courses may only be dropped during the fall drop/add period. Second semester drop/add begins two days after the start of the spring semester and runs for two days. Only second semester courses can be adjusted at this time. Students must see their counselor and not the classroom teacher in order to make the schedule changes. Waitlists are sometimes put in place to ensure fairness in the process, and students must attend the classes on their current schedule until changes have been made and a new schedule processed by the Guidance Department. **Note:** Requests for class placement and/or specific teachers are not allowed. Students may not drop a full-year course after the fall semester drop/add period.

College representative visits — College representatives' visits at HBHS will run from the middle of September until the middle of December. Representatives will be visiting Monday through Friday. This is an opportunity for junior and senior students to meet with representatives from various colleges to learn more about the college or ask additional questions. The list of colleges and dates is located on Naviance. Students will sign up on online, print out their request and obtain their teacher approval and signature indicating they are aware of this missed class. Students are responsible for missed work during this time. A calendar of dates and colleges is on NAVIANCE!

College Fairs — UNH and SNHU are hosting the annual NEACAC college fairs on their campuses. The UNH fair in Durham will be held Thurs., September 22nd from 7-9 pm and Friday, September 23rd from 9-11:30 am. Southern New Hampshire University's fair in Manchester, NH will be Monday, October 3rd 7:00 to 9:00 pm and October 4th from 9:00 am - 11:00 am. Colleges from all over the country will be in attendance. College fairs are a great way for students to obtain information about post-secondary opportunities. Not only is this a good time for seniors and their parents, but for juniors and their parents as well.

SAT Information — Registration for upcoming tests can be done through the College Board website (www.collegeboard.com). Sign up early to get your preferred location! SATs are not offered at HBHS but are available at Nashua, Souhegan, and other local schools. Specific locations are listed online.

Senior News

Seniors and parents will receive a letter from their school counselor indicating their current status in regard to their graduation requirements. Please review this letter and if you are missing credits or are in need of adding a course, please be sure to meet with your counselor immediately.

Many of you have been busy looking at colleges over the summer! When you return to school, please be sure to complete and give to your counselor the recommendation request form, especially if you are considering early action or early decision deadlines. Small group meetings will be held on September 23rd and 26th to review Naviance, Common Application, Essay, Standardized Tests and all pertinent information. Do not forget to look at the College Handbook, found online on the HBHS website (Guidance Tab - College Information). This handbook can answer many of your questions and help give you the information you are looking for in this process.

Mark your calendars for Senior **College Night** that will be held on September 22nd at the high school at 6:30 pm in the auditorium. The Guidance department hosts this night for seniors and their parents to become familiar with the college process and the management of the application procedures. It is important for all seniors and their parents to attend.

FYI, **Financial Aid Night** will be held on Wednesday December 7th, more information will follow.

Junior News

The PSAT will be administered to all juniors on Wednesday, October 12th. The PSAT serves as a practice test for the SAT and as the qualifying tests for juniors to participate in the National Merit Scholarship Program. All juniors will be taking the test free of charge. Counselors meet with students individually in early January to go over the results and how to use the test to prepare for the SAT.

Sophomore News

Sophomores interested in taking the PSAT can sign up in guidance starting September 12th. There is a limit to how many sophomores we can test, but in truth we typically are able to accommodate those interested. Students can contact the local high school that offers the exam on the Saturday, October 15th. These are the only dates you are able to take the PSAT exam.

Freshmen News

Freshmen will meet with their school counselors on the first day of school. We look forward to your arrival! Freshmen and transfer students will attend a half-day of school on Wednesday, August 31st. This day is set aside to allow you the opportunity to meet your teachers, counselors, administrators, find your locker, classrooms and friends and attend lunch in the cafeteria. Additionally, a club and activity fair and an ice cream social is held. Welcome class of 2015!

OPEN HOUSE

Wednesday, September 14, 2011

Parents are cordially invited to attend our Open House on Wednesday, September 14, 2011 at **6:30pm** at the high school.

Open House Schedule: At 6:30pm, there will be a brief presentation in the auditorium by the HBHS Administration. After the presentation, there will be seven 12-minute periods of time simulating periods 1 through 7, following a Monday schedule. The schedule listed below includes 3 minutes of passing time between periods.

Open House gives parents the opportunity to meet teachers, for teachers to briefly discuss expectations and the content of their courses, and for parents to experience their child’s daily schedule. Parents will also have the opportunity to sign up for an evening conference to discuss their child’s progress or to learn about course content in more detail. These conferences are scheduled to be held on the evenings of November 17th & 21st. Teachers will have sign up sheets for these conferences available at Open House.
