From Your Guidance Department

Congratulations to the students at Hollis Brookline High School. Each year as we put together our HBHS School Profile, a document that provides statistical information to college admission officers, we realize how academically competitive our school is. This year our SAT mean scores were: Critical Reading 593, Math 592 and Writing 588, all statistically well above the NH and National average. Our AP scores show that last year 88% of our students received a score of 3, 4, or 5 on this exam, thus earning an opportunity to receive college credit. We have 6 students named as National Merit semifinalists; Maggie Borkowski, Elise Daly, Gregory Partridge, Lauren Pratt, Emily Rowe and Lauren St. Hilaire, as well as 9 commended students: Christopher Baryames, Maxwell Hengeveld, Cooper Hewes, Bridget Keehan, Jake Kobylarz, Erik Nikander, Danielle Putur, Christopher Redus, and Sarah Roberts. No NH public high school has more National Merit Scholars! The School Profile can be found on the HBHS website under the Guidance tab, HBHS School Profile.

Senior News

College Application Deadlines and Important Supplemental Information. One of the most difficult components of the college admissions process is tracking the various deadlines and protocols that are attached to each school. Naviance, our college software program and electronic organization tool, should help students recognize and adhere to the strict college deadlines. Some colleges will cite a 'receipt' deadline, others observe a 'postmarked' deadline, and the more common electronic submission utilizes a digital signature. You do not want to wait to submit your application until the day before a deadline just in case there is a cyber glitch. Common sense dictates to never leave this important application to last minute chance. Early Action or Early Decision deadlines are usually November 1st or November 15th which means that the guidance department should receive the student's *College Supporting Documentation Form* (green) by October 4th and October 25th respectively. A charge of \$3.00 per school application is charged to cover the cost of the college expenditures.

First Quarter Grades. First quarter grades will be sent for every early action or early decision deadline, and mid-year grades will be sent with every student's application. Many schools await the arrival of first quarter grades before moving students into the accepted pile, so students should note that it is very important to keep their academic trend heading in a positive direction.

SAT/ACT Scores. Please remember that the SAT and ACT scores must be sent to each college by the Educational Testing Service in order to be considered official. The SAT scores can be sent through www.collegeboard.com and the ACT scores through www.act.org

Financial Aid Night The Financial Aid Presentation will take place on Thursday, December 7th at 6:30 in the high school auditorium. It is very important for parents to attend this informative evening. This is a time-sensitive date since the FAFSA form cannot be submitted until January 1st. This presentation will also cover information on the CSS Profile. It is important and helpful for parents to check the financial aid requirements for each school to which their child is applying. Some private colleges require the CSS Profile which is accessed through www.collegeboard.com. Early Action or Early Decision Deadlines may require the Profile to be filed earlier.

Another great source of information for financial aid is the NHHEAF organization in Concord. You may contact

NHHEAF at 1-800-525-2577 and online at www.nhheaf.org for free day and evening appointments.

Scholarships. The HBHS guidance website will update new scholarship opportunities for students on a regular basis. Please be sure to check the guidance website for a listing of available scholarships. Local scholarships are more abundant in second semester but national scholarships are available now. Students should also submit a *scholarship transcript request form* found in guidance for any application that needs supplemental information.

NCAA. Do not forget to register with the NCAA if you are planning on participating in college athletics. Please visit www.ncaaclearinghouse.org. Standardized Scores must also be sent directly from the testing agency to the NCAA to be considered official.

GAP Year Fair. Oyster River High School will host a Gap Year Fair for students interested in pursuing a non-traditional post-grad plan. The fair will be held on November 15th from 6:00 to 8:00 pm. For more information please visit www.usagapyearfair.org.

SAT Information—Registration for upcoming tests can be done through the College Board website, www.collegeboard.com. A paper version can be found in the Guidance office should you require this. Deadlines are approaching quickly so be sure to register in time to secure the test location you desire. SATs are not administered at HBHS but rather at Nashua High North and other neighboring high schools

ACT Information — In recent years the ACT has become increasingly popular with New England students. It differs in many respects from the SAT, but primarily it offers a Science component. In addition, some colleges will accept the ACT in lieu of SAT subject tests, which has also enhanced its popularity. The website for the ACT is www.act.org.

SAT Services for Students with Disabilities — A student with a documented disability may be eligible to take PSAT/SAT tests with testing accommodations that support their disability. The student's case manager should be contacted for further details. These accommodations need to be applied for well in advance of the testing date, and the deadline is typically in August for the PSAT and a 7-week minimum advance notice for SAT testing.

Junior News

PSAT. All juniors took the PSAT exam on Wednesday, October 12th. This is a great opportunity for students to compile information that will be helpful in the college application process. Although college admission consists of many factors including transcripts, recommendations, and extra-curricular activities, there is no denying that many schools carefully consider standardized testing. Early results will allow students to prepare for their SAT exams, which we recommended taking before the end of junior year.

College Fair. Nashua High School South is hosting a college fair Monday, November 1st at 6:30pm. This fair helps students see the incredible opportunities that lie ahead of them as more than 200 colleges participate in this event. We recommend filling out the various college post-cards at the fair to receive lots of additional information about prospective schools.

SAT/ACT Services for Students with Disabilities. Students who need testing accommodations for the SATs and ACTs are strongly encouraged to discuss this process with their case managers as soon as possible to ensure the accommodations are available for testing. This process requires submission of documentation to College Board and will take over 7 weeks to complete.

Sophomore News

PSAT. Approximately 50 sophomore students opted to take the PSAT on Wednesday, October 12th. Sophomores who wanted practice with standardized testing and/or students in accelerated classes were encouraged to participate in the practice exam.

Freshmen News

School counselors visited with freshman students this month in their wellness classes. The counselors were incredibly impressed by the class of 2015. Respectful, attentive, appropriate, and engaging are words that come to mind. Our primary goal was to get acquainted with our new students, but we were also able to do a fun activity that allowed us to gather information about their interests and activities. We described our role as counselors and explained how to make guidance appointments. We also discussed bullying and harassment as well as some other emotional issues that present themselves to students during their HBHS years. We are truly happy to have spent time with the freshmen, and we will be returning later in the year with more activities and information.

Student Assistance Program

The Student Assistance Program (SAP) provides confidential services for students whose personal concerns may be affecting their academic performance or behavior at school. Students are encouraged to use the SAP program for help with family problems, emotional concerns, peer issues, and alcohol or drug abuse. Many students are referred to the program through a friend, teacher, counselor or parent. The program offers assessment, referral, supportive and group offerings. Selective Service Registration.

The Selective Service System is an independent agency within the Executive Branch of the Federal Government. The mission of the Selective Service System is to provide the number of men needed by the Armed Forces, within the time required, should Congress and the President decide to return to a draft, in the event of a national emergency. Registration is the process of providing the Selective Service with name, address, phone number, and other related information about one's self. It is a civic and legal responsibility for every young man to register with the Selective Service within the time period starting 30 days before, and ending 30 days after, their 18th birthday. Register online at www.sss.gov or pick up a registration card at any post office.

1. Sign up on Family Connection and print confirmation screen at least 1 day before the college visit.
2. Get signature from the teacher of the class you will be missing.
3. Bring confirmation sheet (signed by teacher) to Guidance on day of visit.
