Eighteen Things 18 Year Olds &

Their Parents Need to Know

Turning 18 is a major milestone and definitely a reason to celebrate. But it is also a game changer! Could you list 18 things that an 18 year old needs to know as they enter this next phase of life? Voting is easy, but what about FERPA? They might know where to buy a lottery ticket, but if they won who would be their beneficiaries? They can easily get a tattoo, but do they have a primary care physician? And, how do their parents go from being in charge to being a coach?

Eighteen year olds (plus or minus a few years) and their parents are invited to a panel discussion on Thursday, May 2nd from 7-9pm in the Gregg Hall auditorium at Nashua Community College to explore the legal, financial, medical and relational challenges that are part of the journey to adulthood today. The event is part of the on-going NCC Lecture Series.

Panelists include Jennifer Starr, Ph.D.; Pam Richardson; attorney Maura Loftus; and Christine Sullivan, DNP. Starr is an advocate for financial literacy for all ages and has taught business and economics at several universities and colleges, including Nashua Community College. Richardson, circulation coordinator at Rivier University, hires, trains and works with 18 - 24 year olds. She also has experience as a social worker and business owner. In her practice, Loftus often deals with legal issues that may involve emotional family dynamics. She is licensed to practice law in New Hampshire and is a member of the NH Bar Association since 1994 and NAELA (National Academy of Elder Law Attorneys). Sullivan is a pediatric nurse practitioner and a faculty member of the nursing program at Rivier. She will provide tips for young adults on navigating the healthcare system.

News from your Guidance Department

Bullying Presentations – Grades 9 and 10. Every fall and spring, the topic of bullying becomes a focal point in the Guidance Department. Given the recent events in the greater New England and Boston community, we are ever so mindful that kindness counts and it is our concern and care for each other that helps to keep us all safe. We strive to be vigilant while listening to our students and make every effort to ensure we are addressing their social/emotional education.

This month, Samantha Benton from Bridges, in Nashua, in conjunction with counselors and administration, held interactive presentations in English and Wellness classes to review the topic of bullying and harassment with all grade 9 and 10 students. The students were able to identify power differences and stereotypes that often lie at the root of bullying. Students were provided information about various forms of bullying and also the consequences of those actions. Most importantly, our students identified people whom they would report instances of bullying to, and were again challenged to care for each other and themselves.

In the year 2013, bullying can no longer be seen as a rite of passage or a normal adolescent problem. We all have the responsibility to intervene and support victims and teach the 'bully' more responsible conduct. We ask parents to sit down and continue this conversation at home and help our students reflect on their own behavior and that of their friends. It is helpful to remind them that respect, fairness and empathy are important. Topics such as citizenship, social expectations, and how to deal with cliques and stereotypes can be profound moments in the life of an adolescent. In this community, we have some of the best and kindest students in the world, but we should not believe that these problems experienced throughout the country are not here. We ask you, as we have asked your children, to please let us know of incidents of bullying so we can come together to ensure that every child here at HBHS is safe and secure as they move through the school day.

Senior News

Spring is *decision making time* for students, especially seniors who are pouring over acceptance letters, reviewing financial aid packages, visiting schools one last time, and developing a list of pros and cons that will enable them to make their final college decision. Congratulations to our senior students and the staggering list of schools to which they have been accepted. With patience, careful consideration, and perhaps some difficulty, 'the decision' will happen and we are very proud of this class.

Update Naviance - Important Information. Naviance and College Notifications! Seniors, PLEASE **update your Naviance account** and record acceptances, denials, wait-list and withdrawal status as soon as that information is known.

Accepted Student Open Houses. Colleges are typically hosting *Accepted Student days* on their campuses in the spring. This is a great time to see the college through the lens of a potential student. Open Houses can provide one more opportunity for students to gather information and visualize their two feet on the campus to assist them in this final college decision process. Many colleges welcome potential students to visit classes and experience the life of a student on their campus. Be sure to take advantage of this opportunity. If you have any questions regarding Financial Aid, it is important to visit the Financial Aid office as well when you are on the campus.

Deposit Date. The national deposit date is May 1st. This is a non-negotiable deadline for schools. If you

miss this deadline without contacting the college, it will jeopardize your acceptance. To ensure your spot in the class, send a written confirmation and a deposit to one college. Seniors should inform colleges they do not plan on attending by email or a phone call so that these colleges may offer admission to other students that may be on their wait-list. This does not hurt colleges' feelings but helps them offer other students an opportunity.

Wait-list. Many schools use a wait-list in the admissions decision process. Although the college of your choice may be the one you are on the wait-list for, be sure to send a deposit to another school as there is no guarantee the college will remove you from the wait-list. If you are placed on a wait-list, it is important to inform the college your strong desire to attend, your continued academic progress, and all the contributions you would bring to the school. Counselors are happy to assist you in this process and support your application.

Financial Aid. If you are struggling to understand your financial aid award, the best resource is the NH Higher Education Assistance Foundation (NHHEAF) in Concord. NHHEAF can be reached by e-mail at www.nhheaf.org or calling 800-525-2577.

NCAA. Senior athletes participating on Division I or II athletic teams in college must register with the NCAA. To register, go to www.eligibilitycenter.org. A final official high school transcript will be sent by HBHS. Remember that SAT scores must also be sent from the educational testing service (i.e. CollegeBoard) to NCAA. Failure to register will delay an athlete's ability to compete at the collegiate level, so it is important to pay attention to these details.

Advanced Placement Testing. Advanced Placement testing will be offered at the beginning of May. Students will receive a detailed letter explaining the exams, room assignments, exam time, supplies and expectations. Please be sure to look for this mailing!

Junior News

A college informational evening was held for parents and junior students to review the entire college process. Counselors also met with juniors in small groups to discuss the process in more detail. Emphasis was placed on Naviance, the college application timeline, SAT tests, and the college search process. Students were introduced to the Common Application (which they will encounter down the road) and college deadlines. Juniors should start scheduling college visits. All appointments to visit college campuses can be made through the admissions office of the college. By notifying the admissions office, students can register for a tour and can inquire as to the possibility of an interview if they so choose.

College Admissions Handbook. The HBHS College Admissions Handbook is available online at www.hollisbrookline.org under the "College Information" tab on the Guidance page. This handbook is a wonderful source of information and contains all the forms needed to get through the maze of paperwork students face their senior year. The handbook allows students and parents an opportunity to learn more about what colleges are looking for, college entrance exams, essay writing, interviews, college visits, NCAA guidelines and financial aid and more.

Military Academies. Students interested in applying to any of the Military Academies in the fall of 2014 please see your counselor as soon as possible. The admissions process is more complicated than applying to most colleges, requires more documentation, and has more deadlines to meet. Therefore, it is in the best interest of the student to have the conversation with his or her counselor early in the process.

SAT Information. The College Admissions Handbook includes a lot of information on testing, SAT Reasoning Tests, and SAT Subject Tests. Registration for upcoming tests is ongoing through the College Board website, www.collegeboard.com. SATs are not administered at HBHS but are available at Milford, Nashua, Souhegan High School and other local schools.

Colleges like to see a junior SAT and a senior SAT score. Students should plan to take the SAT's at least

twice during the college admission process. Students can also take the ACT. Colleges look at the ACT and the SAT interchangeably so there is no disadvantage to taking either or both. Some students find they do better on the ACT than the SAT, so it is worth investigating or asking your counselor about this test. Registration and general ACT information can be found on www.ACT.org

Saturday, June 1, 2013

Registration deadline is typically six weeks prior to test date .

ACT Assessment Dates

June 8, 2013

Note: *The Optional Writing Test for the ACT is highly recommended.*

Please note: **SAT Subject Tests** are required by a small percentage of schools but always by more competitive colleges. Students may want to think about taking these tests at the end of the year of the year they finish the course (e.g. students enrolled in Accelerated Biology or Pre-Calculus may want to take the SAT Subject test for Biology or Math II at the conclusion of their class).

It is important to plan testing around busy sports and activity schedules in the spring. Check with coaches and club advisors as to your availability to avoid potential conflict.

Girls State. Girls State is a program for girls in their junior year that want to learn more about government and politics. It will be held June 23-29, 2013 at Franklin Pierce University. More information and applications can be found in Guidance. Deadline to apply is May 15, 2013.

This spring, the sophomore class has been focusing on career paths. Mrs. Sullivan, School-to-Career Counselor, held the Career Symposium on Friday, April 19, 2013. Students participated in the symposium and

had the opportunity to hear from speakers representing many different careers.

School counselors will be holding a **College Informational Evening** Presentation for 10th grade students and their parents on May 8th at 6:30 pm in the auditorium (*please note new time and date*). This evening is an opportunity to get a jump on the college process. Parents will receive notification via postcard and email in early May.

NEW! Career Exploration Sessions. In response to feedback from sophomore students following the career symposium, HBHS is now offer career exploration sessions to junior and senior students. These small group sessions will be offered monthly on a sign-up basis through Naviance. In April and May students will have the opportunity to meet with a physician and video game designer. Interested students can get additional information in the Guidance Office.

Camp Fully Involved at NH Fire Academy. Camp Fully Involved is a camp that provides young women with a comprehensive overview of the firefighting profession. An information session will be held at the New Hampshire Fire Academy July 28-August 2 in Concord, NH. Cadets, is open to young women ages 14-20 who are considering a career in fire fighting or emergency medical services, as well as those who are looking for a summer adventure are welcome.
