Some thoughts from the Principal ...

We have just begun our fourth quarter and continue to encourage all of our students, especially our seniors, to finish their year academically strong. With the beautiful spring weather arriving early, it is especially tempting to let the focus turn to outside activities. Spring began with another resounding success by the theatre department's performance of *Curtains!* Underclassmen have completed their course selections and seniors are in the process of finalizing plans for next year and looking forward to senior week and graduation activities. Graduation will be held on Saturday, June 12th and the last day for grades 9 – 11 will be Friday, June 18th. The Senior Prom is set for Saturday, May 15th at the Radisson Hotel, in South Nashua from 6:30 pm to midnight. Their theme this year is "A Night on Mount Olympus". And the senior trip, a white water rafting excursion in Maine, is scheduled for June 7th and 8th, with all paperwork and their \$50 fee due by April 15th.

The last few months of the school year are always very busy here at HBHS! Spring Sports are underway and there are many events being planned by the Athletics Office. Performing Arts is planning concerts, including a Tri-town concert and an all district festival, guitar night, jazz and Improv nights, and the spring play. Student Council will be holding elections and is planning Field Day. Guidance has scheduled an Award Letter Information Night and the 8th Grade Fair. And the end of year academic awards ceremonies and Senior Week activities are in the works – please check our school website and click on "Calendar of Events" for details.

Last year we initiated a process where the school community recognizes and honors educators, administrators, coaches, and community members who have made significant contributions through service, participation, or involvement in athletics in the high school. On Friday, May 8th, the Hollis Brookline High School Hall of Fame will induct its second class of individuals into the HBHS Hall of Fame. The initial class included Vicki Parady-Guay, Don Hunt, Lou (Coach) Korcoulis, Bob McGettigan, Dusty Rich and Carroll Spaulding.

The Math Team recently won the State title for Class I Schools held in Plymouth. For the second consecutive year, their performance actually put them at the top of ALL New Hampshire schools, Class L and private. Congratulations to the team and their advisors, math teachers Stacey Plummer and Sue Mooers. The US First Robotics team won our regional competition in early March and is on its way for the first time to Atlanta, Georgia for the World Championship Competition to be held April 14-18th. They are looking forward to competing against over 300 teams from Brazil, Australia, Israel, Mexico and Canada as well as teams from all over the United States. Congratulations to Sue Hay, our Robotics Mentors, and the 41 students participating in these events. We wish them the best of luck!!

During the month of May, we will be administering AP and NECAP Testing. AP testing will take place between May 3rd and May 12th. At this time, we have students signed up to take 341 AP Exams, a record number for HBHS. The NECAP Science State test for juniors will be administered during the morning on May 19th and 20th.

On Saturday, March 28th, ten teams competed in this year's State Science Olympiad Competition hosted by Hollis Brookline, under the direction of science teachers Gina Bergskaug and John Boucher. Besides the many staff people who gave up their Saturday to help manage the participants and correcting, the PTSA facilitated the lunch for over 150 people and assisted as proctors, engineering experts, and "go to" people for our teams. In addition, the PTSA is once again stepping up to the plate (pun) for Teacher Appreciation Week, May 4 – 8, as well as assisting at the student field day barbeque on May 26th. It means a lot to our school community to see the support of the families of our students.

In closing and on behalf of all our staff, I would like to express our appreciation for all the work that the PTSA continues to do in support of our students, staff and programs offered at the school. The school community is especially thankful for the support shown at the annual district meeting.

From Your Guidance Department

There is no doubt that we are being blessed with a beautiful spring. Every rainy day has been offset with a sunny day bearing high temperatures and warm breezes. If you work in a school and you want to know what season it is, you need only look down the hallways, where overnight and almost by magic, or maybe text message, boots are replaced with flip flops and sweats turn into shorts! Fourth quarter is coming our way fast and furiously and it won't be long before June is here!

Course Registration – (Grades 9, 10, 11) As you receive this newsletter we will be finishing up the yearly process of course selection. With a successful evening presentation to the parents of 8th grade students and an evening presentation to the parents of 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students, all

prior to the onset of electronic course selection, we have attempted to provide families with lots of information to assist students in making appropriate course selections. This being the fourth year utilizing the online process, students were easily able to navigate the system. We always appreciate your patience and your thoughtful selection and attention to this activity. It is such an important part of what we do, and with the master schedule being worked on in the next few weeks we will be well on our way to setting up schedules for the upcoming year.

Counselors will now begin reviewing the course selection sheets and hope that students gathered teacher recommendations and had conversations about the correct placement for next year. We are confident that these conversations will be very helpful to students as they begin next year in the most appropriate rigorous course that they will be successful in. Should you have new or lingering concerns, please feel free to continue these communications even though the process of selecting the courses is over. It is an important part of each student's progress at HBHS.

Over April vacation the master schedule will be developed and we hope to have tentative schedules distributed in June.

Senior News

Spring is *decision making time* for students, especially seniors who are pouring over acceptance letters, reviewing financial aid packages, visiting schools one last time, and developing a list of pros and cons that will enable them to make their final decision. Please don't forget to attend our last evening presentation **Financial Award Presentation** which will be held on **April, 21st at 6:30 in room 221**. NHHEAF will speak to parents about the various **award packages** you have received from colleges and provide information to assist you in understanding and making the best financial decision possible. We are impressed with our senior students and the staggering list of schools that they have been accepted to (all of which will be listed in the HBHS profile for next year). With patience, careful consideration, and perhaps some difficulty, 'the decision' will happen and the senior class will be in that wonderful place of saying farewell to what they have come to know so well, to quickly longing for a new experience, one that will be decidedly different and filled with great new opportunities.

Accepted Student Open Houses - Colleges are typically hosting *Accepted Student days* on their campus' in the spring. This is a great time to see the college through the lens of a potential student. Open Houses can provide one more opportunity for students to gather information and visualize their two feet on the campus to assist them in this final college decision process. Colleges generally welcome potential students to visit classes and experience the life of a student on their campus. Be sure to take advantage of this opportunity. If you have any questions regarding Financial Aid, it is important to visit the Financial Aid office as well when you are on the campus.

Deposit Date - The national deposit date is May 1st. This is a non-negotiable deadline for schools. If you miss this deadline, without contacting the college, it will jeopardize your acceptance. To ensure your spot in the class, send a written confirmation and a deposit to one college. Seniors should inform colleges they do not plan on attending by e-mail or a phone call so that these colleges may offer admission to other students that may be on their waitlist. This does not hurt colleges' feelings but helps them offer other students an opportunity.

Waitlist - Many schools use a waitlist in the admission decision process. Although the college of your choice may be the one you are on the waitlist for, be sure to deposit at another school as there is no guarantee the college will use the waitlist.

Financial Aid - If you are struggling to understand your financial aid award, the best resource is the NH Higher Education Assistance Foundation (NHHEAF) in Concord. NHHEAF can be reached by e-mail www.nhheaf.org or calling 1-800-525-2577.

Scholarships - A list of scholarships is located on the website under Guidance – Scholarships, and is updated as scholarships are received. Applications are available in the Guidance office or directions are provided to appropriate websites. The deadlines are quickly approaching and often there is corresponding paperwork that must be submitted with the applications, such as transcripts, SAT scores, teacher and counselor letters of recommendation. There is a scholarship request form located in guidance that should be filled out for each scholarship application that will allow you to note the corresponding paperwork required. This purple scholarship request form should be given to the counselor several days in advance of the scholarship deadline. Remember, recommendations are confidential and need to be sent through the Guidance Office. We are fortunate to have such generous local sponsors, please make sure you visit the website.

NCAA - Senior Athletes interested in participating on athletic teams in college must register with the NCAA. This may be done online at www.ncaaclearinghouse.net. The NCAA (Clearinghouse) Eligibility Center will require that a transcript be sent through the mail. Guidance is happy to send the transcript to the Eligibility Center, but students must alert the guidance office as to their intent. SAT scores must also be sent from the educational testing service. Failure to register will delay the athlete's ability to compete at the collegiate level, so it is important to get these to Guidance as soon as possible.

Junior News

A college informational evening and small groups were held with junior students reviewing the entire college process. Emphasis was placed on the timeline, SAT tests, and the College Search. However lots of information was shared regarding the Common Application (which they will encounter down the road), College Deadlines, and GAP year alternatives. With the April vacation on the horizon, it is helpful to start scheduling college visits. All appointments to visit college campuses can be made through the admissions office of the college. By notifying the admissions office, students can be assured a tour and can inquire as to the possibility of an interview if they so choose.

College Admission Handbook - The College Admission Handbook has been updated and is available online. This handbook is a wonderful source of information and has all the forms needed to get through the maze of paperwork students face their senior year. It also has a list of helpful websites. The handbook allows students and parents an opportunity to learn more about what colleges are looking for, college entrance exams, essay writing, interviews, college visits, NCAA guidelines and financial aid and more. Military Academies - Students interested in applying to any of the Military Academies for fall of 2010 please see your counselor as soon as possible. The admission process is more complicated than applying to most colleges, needs more documentation and has more deadlines to meet. Therefore it is in the best interest of the student to have the conversation with his or her counselor early in the process.

SAT Information - The college admission handbook

includes a lot of information on testing, SAT Reasoning Tests, and SAT Subject Tests. Registration for upcoming tests is ongoing through the College Board website www.collegeboard.com. SAT's are not administered at HBHS but are available at Milford, Nashua, Souhegan High School and other local schools.

Colleges like to see a junior SAT and a senior SAT score. Students should plan to take the SAT's at least twice during the college admission process. Students can also take the ACT. Colleges look at the ACT and the SAT interchangeably so there is no disadvantage to taking either or both. Some students find they do better on the ACT than the SAT, so it is worth investigating or asking your counselor about this test. Registration and general ACT information can be found on www.ACT.org

Score Choice – This was new last year and allows students to have SAT scores sent in one of two ways. Students can elect to have all scores sent (where colleges will typically select the highest individual score for each test) or students can elect to send scores via test date. This option of score choice also pertains to subject test scores that have been taken in the past. More information can be found on the College Board website.

Please note: SAT Subject Tests are required by a small percentage of schools but always by more competitive colleges. Students may want to think about taking these tests at the end of the year they finish the class (i.e.: Accelerated Biology or Pre-Calculus students may want to take the SAT in biology or math at the end of 9th/10th grade).

It is important to plan testing around busy sports and activity schedules in the spring. Check with coaches and club advisors as to your availability to avoid potential conflict.

Advanced Placement Testing: Advanced Placement Testing will be offered during the first two weeks of May. Students will receive a detailed letter about the exams, room assignments, exam time, supplies and expectations. This letter will be sent home the week before April vacation. Please be sure to look for this mailing.

Selective Service Registration

The Selective Service System is an independent agency within the Executive Branch of the Federal government. The mission of the Selective Service System is to provide the number of men needed by the Armed Forces, within the time required, should Congress and the President decide to return to a draft, in the event of a national emergency. Registration is the process of providing the Selective Service with a name, address, phone number, and other related information about one's self. It is a civic and legal responsibility for every young man to register with the Selective Service within the time period starting 30 days before, and ending 30 days after, their 18th birthday. Register online at www.sss.gov, or pick up a registration card at any post office. If you have any questions, please see Mr. Winslow in Guidance.
