## *Some thoughts from the Principal ...*

It does not seem possible that another summer has gone by and we find ourselves preparing for the opening of school in just a few weeks. While the weather has been less than perfect, it is hopeful that the summer will close on a more reasonable note. The fall athletes have reported to tryouts and soon it will be time to welcome everyone to the 2009-10 school year. Throughout the summer, the building has been a busy place as we prepare for the opening of school and we are very excited about the upcoming school year. We would like to welcome our new High School Special Education Coordinator, Grace Laliberte, formerly of the Londonderry School District, who replaces Jeanne Moulin-Hayes. New staff members have all been hired and we hope to introduce them in future newsletters.

The grounds, like most of our lawns, are very green thanks to Mother Nature, and the building looks better than ever due to the efforts of Mr. John Gray and his hard working custodial crew. Two summer projects included finishing off room 373 as a science lab, leftover from the 2001 expansion, and the reseeding of the side field. With enrollment projected to be similar to last year, the building will once again be tight but all students have been scheduled into classes, with few, if any, rooms to spare.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind all that we continue to emphasize that the key to establishing a community at Hollis Brookline High School is by building positive relationships and providing all students with a rigorous and relevant education. This is an ongoing process, that begins with a strong teaching staff, one that sets the bar high, while at the same time is compassionate in assisting their students to succeed. You will not find a better staff than the ones we have here at Hollis Brookline, and we are once again excited about the new additions we are adding this year.

The beneficial relationships that are established are ultimately based on communication. As the year begins, our teachers will distribute classroom expectations containing contact information, and expect that parents will partner with them in providing the best educational experience for your child. We also hope to continue to distribute this newsletter and other school information via email and ask that you assist us in making sure that the email addresses we have on file are up to date.

This year we are eagerly anticipating a new initiative called **Seniors as Leaders Together (SaLT)**. On September 2<sup>nd</sup>, all members of the Senior class will attend a day-long team-building session with the goal of developing mutual trust as well as cooperative problem solving and leadership skills. The long term goal for this initiative is that the Senior class will have a stronger connection to each other, to the school, will share leadership roles, and build a sense of community throughout the year. The program is being funded outside the operating budget, through donations, and we are working to develop cooperative sponsorships. Data will be collected this year to help us assess the success of this initiative, with the hope being to make this a yearly program for the Senior class. Seniors should have received an informational mailing on the **SaLT Program** during the summer.

Enclosed with this newsletter is some important information about the start of the 2009-2010 academic year. Please review this information carefully with your son/daughter. Please note the Open House is scheduled early this year, on Thursday, September 10<sup>th</sup> and will begin at 6:30pm. At that time you will have the opportunity to meet your child's teachers and to hear about classroom expectations, and have the opportunity to sign up for individual parent conferences which will be held on the evenings of November 19<sup>th</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup>.

There have also been some adjustments made within our student handbook that your child will receive at the beginning of the year. We will go over the significant changes in the handbook with the students at the beginning of the year. This year we will distribute the student handbook as a .PDF file, emailed to each family. The document is also available to download on the school website. We have been using email as a tool to communicate with families since last year, including distribution of this newsletter. A file of those who do not have access to email is maintained so that copies of the newsletter can be mailed home. We will make sure that student handbooks are distributed to those in this file as well. The Student Handbook will be emailed home on August 31<sup>st</sup>, the first day of school for all students.

As we begin the year together, I would like to remind all families that in order for students to excel in school they need support from both the school and the home. As parents, we ask that you be positive, yet firm, in your encouragement and support of your son/daughter; to support and reinforce the importance of education by staying in touch with their teachers; and to monitor their academic progress. I look forward to working with you and your student and wish you the best for the upcoming school year. With your support we can create a rigorous, relevant and respectful learning environment where all students can succeed.

Our mission statement calls for students to take advantage of the broad range of experiences at our school, which will encourage them to strive for their maximum intellectual, artistic, emotional, social and physical development. Our mission to inspire lifelong learning and achievement applies to the entire school community, that we value individuality, and believe that an atmosphere of mutual trust and respect is essential to the educational process.

With the help of the entire school community, it is our intention that we live up to the mission and provide each student with the education, skills, and self-confidence to be successful in the post secondary experience of their choice. If I, or any member of the staff, can be of assistance to you, please contact me in the main office or in the halls.

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## Open House

Parents are cordially invited to attend our annual Open House on Thursday, September 10<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 PM. There will be a brief presentation by the Hollis Brookline High School Administration, followed by an abbreviated schedule of a regular school day. There will be seven 12-minute periods to allow parents to follow their child's schedule. Open House gives parents the opportunity to meet the teachers and for teachers to briefly discuss their courses. (Please see the form included in the newsletter.)

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## Locker Assignments

All students will have a locker. Returning students will retain the same locker they had last year. If you have any difficulties with combinations, please report them to the main office. Locker assignments will be given out on the first day of school. As we are growing in numbers, some freshmen may be assigned a half locker. Please remember that the lockers are provided with locks for the protection of school materials and student's private property. **Please note that valuables and cash should never be left in a locker.** You are responsible for the materials that are assigned to you for the year. All school materials must be returned by the last day of school. Lockers are cleaned out at the close of each school year.

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## Dismissals

While we understand that on occasion, emergencies arise which require your student to be dismissed early, we ask that whenever possible, you schedule your student's appointments at times which do not conflict with school hours. Students should never be dismissed because of a study hall that falls at the end of the day. When your student must be dismissed early, we ask that you please send a written note prior to the dismissal. **All notes should be submitted to the attendance secretary first thing in the morning.**

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## School Pictures and Yearbook

Underclass photographs will be taken on Wednesday, September 30<sup>th</sup>. Order forms will be available at the be-

ginning of the school year and should be returned on picture day. Picture retake day will be announced at a later date. Reminder to Seniors: Senior photographs are due no later than Friday, October 2<sup>nd</sup>. They must be in .jpeg format and submitted by email or by CD only. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Brigitte MacMillan, 465-2269. See the Daily Notices on our website for more information. **All yearbooks must be preordered.**

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## Parking Permits

Parking permits will be required for all students parking in the student parking lot. Parking spaces are limited. Last year's permit will not be honored and all students must apply for the new parking permit at a cost of \$40.00 for the year. Parking Permits are available on line. Permits will be granted on a first come, first served basis to Seniors from August 31<sup>st</sup> through September 8<sup>th</sup> in the Main Office. Applications for Juniors will be accepted from September 9<sup>th</sup> through September 15<sup>th</sup> in the Main Office and will be placed in a lottery. Names for Juniors will be drawn for the remaining parking spots on September 15<sup>th</sup>. **No students will be permitted to park in front of the school except at the lower ballfields. All cars parked in the back parking lot after September 16<sup>th</sup> must have a parking permit. (Applications will be available in the Main Office and on the HBHS website.)**

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## School Supplies

As a general rule, it is best to wait until school opens to purchase supplies. Teachers have individual requirements for their classes and will announce their requirements during the opening days of class. Pens, pencils and paper are appropriate for all classes.

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**The Cavalier Chronicle**, the HBHS student newspaper, is published the third Friday of every month. Be sure to ask your kids to bring their copy home to share with you. We welcome parent input for story ideas by the first of every month (perhaps your teen is doing something newsworthy outside of school but is too shy to let us know). ## Selective Service Registration



The Selective Service System is an independent agency within the Executive Branch of the Federal government. The mission of the Selective Service System is to provide the number of men needed by the Armed Forces, within the time required, should Congress and the President decide to return to a draft, in the event of a national emergency. Registration is the process of providing the Selective Service with a name, address, phone number, and other related information about one's self. It is a civic and legal responsibility for every young man to register with the Selective Service within the time period starting 30 days before, and ending 30 days after, their 18th birthday. 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### **Schedule Changes**

As of August 28<sup>th</sup>, students are asked to keep their current schedules for a short time with no changes until the drop/add period begins. Only students who are Seniors and in need of a graduation requirement, a student with fewer than 6 credits, or a student placed in the wrong class (physics instead of physical science) may contact the guidance counselor immediately. Other students who desire changes will be seen at the beginning of drop/add which will begin September 2<sup>nd</sup> and will close at the end of the day on the 8<sup>th</sup>. Students are advised to make an appointment with their counselor to seek a schedule change. Second semester schedule changes will be reached but with a lower priority. Waitlists are sometimes put in place to ensure fairness in the process, and students must attend the classes on their current schedule until changes have been made and a new schedule is processed by the Guidance Department. It is hoped that the care that you exercised in the spring will eliminate and reduce the practice of drop/add, but for those exceptions please pay close attention to this procedure.

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### **How to make a Guidance Appointment**

Students wishing a guidance appointment can fill out an appointment request form in the guidance office. Your counselor will send you your appointment as your request serves as a pass. If it is an emergency, please let Mrs. Noel know or check off on the slip that you need to see someone immediately. Parents wishing to make a guidance appointment should call or email their son/daughter's school counselor.

### **Senior Checklist**

Seniors and your parents will receive a letter from their school counselor reviewing graduation requirements (those completed and those still needed). Upon review, it is important that each senior check with his or her counselor (again) to make sure credits are in place for June graduation. If you are missing a credit, or in need of adding a course, please be sure to let your counselor know immediately.

### **SAT Test Dates**

The dates for the 2009 – 2010 school year are as follows:

\*Dates most Juniors take the Critical Reasoning Tests.

The SAT is not administered at HBHS, but is available at Nashua High School North and other area high schools. Register online at [www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com); paper applications are available in the guidance office. Seniors who have not taken the test or who wish to repeat the test should register early for fall test dates. Subject tests are required by some competitive colleges. Students should research the college requirements of their schools so they are aware of the individual college requirements. Counselors review with all students the various college entrance tests, PSAT, SAT and ACT exams.

### **SAT services for students with disabilities**

A student with a documented disability may be eligible to take PSAT/SAT tests with testing accommodations that support their disability. The student's case manager should be contacted for a referral to the Special Education Coordinator.

### **Senior Parent and Student College Night**

Please mark your calendars for Thursday, September 17<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm. The School Counselors will host a College Information Night. This is an opportunity for seniors and their parents to become familiar with the College Process and the technicalities of the process. It is very important for all seniors and parents to attend.

### **Senior Small Group Presentations**

As has been our past practice, we plan to conduct small group sessions with our senior students early once again this year. We are tentatively aiming for September 18<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>! These are held in a timely manner to answer all remaining questions and in plenty of time to prepare for even the earliest of timelines!

### **Financial Aid Night**

The Guidance Department is planning a Financial Aid Information Evening on December 3<sup>rd</sup>. This is routinely held in early December as the FAFSA form is unable to be completed until January 2010. Please mark your calendars and we will send you reminders!

### **College Admission Representative Visits**

College representatives' visits at HBHS will begin on September 14<sup>th</sup> and will run until the middle of November. Most representatives will be visiting on Mondays and Wednesdays. This is a great opportunity to meet with representatives from various colleges to learn more about the schools or ask further questions. Also it is an opportunity to make a face-to-face contact with potentially the person reviewing your file. In an era where college interviews are becoming fewer and fewer, I urge you to stay apprised of the various representative visits; we will post them on the guidance website! Students can obtain a pass from Mrs. Noel and must have approval from their teacher if they are missing a class. They are responsible for work missed.

### **PSAT**

The PSAT will be administered to all Juniors on Wednesday, October 14, 2009. The PSAT serves as a practice test for the SAT and as the qualifying test for Juniors to participate in the National Merit Scholarship Program. All Juniors will be taking the exam free of charge. We are planning on offering interested **sophomores** the opportunity to take the PSAT as well. We will be holding a sign-up and will announce more information of this around the second week of September and on our website. There will be a fee for sophomores interested in taking the exam.

### **Freshman News**

School Counselors will be meeting with freshmen on their first day of school. We will also be visiting you in your wellness class later in September. We look forward to meeting you all!
