I am grateful for having the opportunity to get to know many of you over the last four years. I can tell you that I have never been more excited than I am now as I assume the role of principal of what is widely regarded as the best high school in New Hampshire. Hollis Brookline High School is among the best due in large part to the wonderful support of parents, community members, and staff who are all committed to the individual excellence of every single child in the building. We have been nominated as a Blue Ribbon school by the U. S. Department of Education, received national recognition during each of the last three years, and we regularly send more students than most to competitive colleges across the country. On standardized testing (such as NECAP, PSAT, SAT, and AP), our students continually soar high above the State and national averages. This is all a result of the collective dedication and commitment of the community.

Finally, the biggest factor in all of this: We have wonderful students who come from supportive and caring families. I am continually amazed at just how hard each of our students strives to be their best. We welcome Mr. Rick Barnes to HBHS as Assistant Principal. Mr. Barnes has been on board, working diligently, since July 1st and has already proven himself as a wonderful addition to our staff. Among a myriad of other things, Rick will be working with all freshmen this year and helping to make the transition into high school a positive experience for our students. Other new staff members have been hired and I will introduce them in an upcoming newsletter!

I would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone that we continually emphasize that the key to a successful educational experience is building positive relationships and providing all students with a rigorous and relevant education. Our excellent teaching staff continually sets the bar at a high, yet attainable, level for students. They will continue to work compassionately with all students to help them reach their goals. We are excited about the new staff members we have hired and know that they will be committed, valued and successful members of the HBHS community.

Our dedicated and hard-working custodial crew, led by Mr. John Gray, has worked long and hard over the summer and the school looks fabulous! Students will excel in school when we work together, hand-in-hand, supporting student achievement both at school and at home. Opening of School

Students will be engaging in a variety of experiences that will ultimately lead to their success and confidence within our school community. Students will be dismissed at 12:04 PM. ALL STUDENTS WILL ATTEND SCHOOL ON THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 2ND.

Physical Exam Requirements for the 2010-11 School Year

All incoming freshmen are required to have a physical exam in order to enter Hollis Brookline High School. All juniors participating in athletics are required to have a physical exam prior to the start of their season. Open House

Parents are cordially invited to attend our annual Open House on Thursday, September 23RD at 6:30 PM. There will be a brief presentation by the Hollis Brookline High School Administration, followed by an abbreviated schedule of a regular school day. There will be seven 12-minute periods to allow parents to follow their child's schedule. Open House gives parents the opportunity to meet the teachers and for teachers to briefly discuss their courses. (Please see the form included in the newsletter.)

Locker Assignments

All students will have a locker. Returning students will retain the same locker they had last year. If you have any difficulties with combinations, please report them to the main office. Locker assignments will be given out on the first day of school. As we are growing in numbers, some freshmen may be assigned a half locker. Please remember that the lockers are provided with locks for the protection of school materials and student's private property. **Please note that valuables and cash should never be left in a locker.** You are responsible for the materials that are assigned to you for the year. All school materials must be returned by the last day of school. Lockers are cleaned out at the close of each school year.

Dismissals

While we understand that on occasion, emergencies arise which require your student to be dismissed early, we ask that whenever possible, you schedule your student's appointments at times which do not conflict with school hours. Students should never be dismissed because of a study hall that falls at the end of the day. When your student must be dismissed early, we ask that you please send a written note prior to the dismissal. **All notes should be submitted to the attendance secretary first thing in the morning.**

School Pictures and Yearbook

Underclassmen photographs will be taken on Thursday, September 17th. Order forms will be available at the beginning of the school year and should be returned on picture day. Picture retake day will be announced at a later date. Reminder to seniors: Senior photographs are due no later than Friday, October 1st. School Supplies

As a general rule, it is best to wait until school opens to purchase supplies. Teachers have individual requirements for their classes and will announce their requirements during the opening days of class. Pens, pencils and paper are appropriate for all classes.

Parking Permits

Parking permits will be required for all students parking in the student parking lot in the back of the building. Last year's permit will not be honored and all students must apply for the new parking permit at a cost of \$40.00 for the year. Parking Permits are limited and are available on our website under student information. A copy of your driver's license is required with your application. Permits will be granted on a first come, first served basis to seniors from September 1st through September 8th in the Main Office. Applications for Juniors will be accepted from September 9th through September 14th in the Main Office and will be placed in a lottery. Names for Juniors will be drawn for the remaining parking spots on September 15th. **No students will be permitted to park in front of the school except at the lower ballfields. All cars parked in the back parking lot after September 16th must have a parking permit. (Applications are available in the Main Office and on the HBHS Web Site.)**

Selective Service Registration

The Selective Service System is an independent agency within the Executive Branch of the Federal government. The mission of the Selective Service System is to provide the number of men needed by the Armed Forces, within the time required, should Congress and the President decide to return to a draft, in the event of a national emergency. Registration is the process of providing the Selective Service with a name, address, phone number, and other related information about one's self. It is a civic and legal responsibility for every young man to register with the Selective Service within the time period starting 30 days before, and ending 30 days after, their 18th birthday. Power School Parent Portal Last year we counselors were very busy acclimating to the new student information system. In less than a year we have become quite dependent on the offerings of this system. We encourage you to utilize the parent portal to stay abreast of your children's education and progress, particularly when students have been ill and out of school, and to make teacher contact should you feel your child is not performing as desired. Should you forget or lose your account information, please contact Mrs. Tyler at extension 126.

How to make a Guidance Appointment Students wishing a Guidance appointment can fill out an appointment request form in the Guidance office. Your counselor will send you your appointment as your request serves as a pass. If it is an emergency, please let Mrs. Noel know or check off on the slip that you need to see someone immediately. Parents wishing to make a Guidance appointment should call or email their son/daughter's school counselor.

Schedule Changes As of August 28th, students are asked to keep their current schedules, with no changes until the drop/add period begins. The only exceptions to this rule are: students who are seniors and in need of a graduation requirement, a student with fewer than 6 credits, a student placed in the wrong class (physics instead of physical science), or a student who has not met the prerequisite of a course on the first semester schedule. We encourage the above students to contact their guidance counselor immediately. Other students who desire changes will be seen at the beginning of drop/add, which will begin September 8th and will close at the end of the day on the 10th. Students are advised to make an appointment with their counselor to seek a schedule change. Second semester schedule changes will be reached but with a lower priority. Wait lists are sometimes put in place to ensure fairness in the process, and students must attend the classes on their current schedule until changes have been made and a new schedule is processed by the Guidance Department. It is hoped that the care that you exercised in the spring will eliminate and reduce the practice of drop/add, but for those exceptions please pay close attention to this procedure.

Important Senior Information The Guidance staff will hold the Senior Evening - College Informational Night on Thursday, September 16th at 6:30 in the auditorium. We ask that both parents and students attend. This presentation is held to review information regarding the college application process and make sure that all students and families are receiving adequate information as they move into the senior year. We are well aware of the demands the college application process places on both students and families and will assist you in this process every step of the way! Guidance will hold small college groups with students following this evening. Groups are tentatively planned for September 20th and 24th. Students will receive notices of their exact date and time. Counselors will be reviewing with students a new computer tool called Naviance which will be used to enhance the college application process and enhance the electronic college application process.

Financial Aid Night The Guidance Department is planning a Financial Aid Information Evening on December 9, 2010 at 6:30 pm. This event is routinely held in early December as the FAFSA form is unable to be completed until January 1, 2011. Please mark your calendars and we will send you reminders! Until then, always check with financial aid offices if you are applying early to colleges to ensure that you are aware of the forms each college utilizes and the due dates.

SAT Test Dates The test dates for the 2010 -2011 school year are as follows:

October 9, 2010	registration by September 10, 2010
November 6, 2010	registration by October 8, 2010
December 4, 2010	registration by November 5, 2010
January 22, 2011	registration by December 23, 2010
March 12, 2011	registration by February 11, 2011
May 7, 2011	registration by April 8, 2011
June 4, 2011	registration by May 6, 2011

The SAT is not administered at HBHS, but is available at Nashua High School North and other area high schools. Students should register online at www.collegeboard.com and make sure that results are sent from the CollegeBoard to schools they are intending to apply to. Scores are deemed official only when received from the testing site. Seniors who have not taken the test or who wish to repeat the test should register early for fall test dates. Subject tests are required by some competitive colleges. Students should research the college requirements of their schools so they are aware of the individual college requirements.

AP Test Dates 2011 Advanced Placement exams will run the first two weeks of May. Tests begin on Monday, May 2, 2011 and will end on May 14th. Please be aware of these dates as you plan your yearly schedules.

AP Test Results In May, 2010, 339 AP tests were administered to 186 Hollis Brookline High School 11th and 12th grade students. Results were received in July and once again our students performed with excellence! 84% of the total exams taken at HBHS earned a score of 3 or higher. 28% of the exams received a perfect score of 5. Advanced Placement exams are scored on a scale of 1-5 and students may receive college credit or advanced placement in courses based on their score and their college's policy. It is strongly recommended that students enrolled in Advanced Placement classes take the AP exam. Students who are not enrolled in the class, however, may still elect to take the exam.

Senior Graduation Requirements Seniors and parents will receive a letter from your school counselor in early September reviewing graduation requirements (those courses completed and those courses required for graduation). Upon review it is important that each senior check with his/her counselor to ensure that all requirements will be successfully completed for June graduation. If you are missing a credit, or in need of adding a course, please be sure to see your counselor immediately!

College representatives' visits at HBHS will begin in early September and will run until the middle/end of November. Most representatives will be visiting on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. This is a great opportunity to meet with representatives from various colleges to learn more about the schools or ask further questions. Also, it is an opportunity to make a face-to-face contact with potentially the person reviewing your file. In an era where college interviews are becoming fewer and fewer, we urge you to stay apprised of the various representative visits. Admission rep visits will be posted on the **Guidance website!** Students may obtain a pass from Mrs. Noel and must have approval from their teacher if they will be missing a class. Students are responsible for work missed. To view the list of colleges that visited last year, go to the Guidance home page, click on college and scroll down to HBHS College Visit Schedule.

PSAT The PSAT will be administered to all juniors on Wednesday, October 13, 2010. The PSAT serves as a practice test for the SAT and as the qualifying test for juniors to participate in the National Merit Scholarship Program. All juniors will be taking the exam free of charge. We are planning on offering interested **sophomores** the opportunity to take the PSAT as well. We will be holding a sign up and will announce more information of this around the second week of September and on our website. There will be a fee for sophomores interested in taking the exam.

Freshman News As always, school counselors will be actively involved in the freshman and transfer students' first day of school. We plan this day to help you become acclimated and comfortable in your new setting. Students will follow a mini schedule, meet their teachers, meet their Guidance counselor, learn their locker combinations, visit the cafeteria, attend a club and activities fair and become acquainted with the high school community. We look forward to this big day and offer you the warmest of welcomes!

Transfer Students On August 25th at 11:00 the Student Services Dept. will be offering a luncheon to all students who are transferring here to HBHS! We hope that this opportunity will allow all transfer students to become a little more familiar with each other and the school to assist you in your transition. Invitations will be sent as each student registers.

Student Assistance Program - would like to provide information on **CAST - Community Action for Safe Teens**. CAST is a grass-roots coalition, serving the communities of Amherst, Brookline, Hollis, Milford, Mont Vernon and Wilton whose mission is focused on supporting and strengthening families, reducing the use/abuse of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs, and encouraging healthy choices by teens. 
